Artefact	an object made by a human being
Autobiography	a story of one's own life and achievements
Biography	a story of someone's life and achievements
Chronological order	in order of time, from earliest to most recent
Curator	a keeper of a museum
Exhibit	an item displayed in a museum
Hero	a person admired for their courage, achievements or noble qualities
Local	the surrounding area, or a person who lives there
Museum	a building that houses collections of interesting or important objects

KEY KNOWLEDGE:
QUESTION 1: Who was George Albert Cairns?
ANSWER George Albert Cairns (1913-1944) was the last winner of the Victoria Cross and lived and worked in Sidcup.
QUESTION 2: Who was Sir John Champneys?
ANSWER Sir John Champneys (1495 – 1556) was Lord Mayor of London in 1534 and began to build Hall Place in 1537. He lies buried in Old Bexley.
QUESTION 3: Who was Augustus Applegath?
ANSWER Augustus Applegath (1788 – 1871) was the inventor of the vertical printing press. He built Shenstone house and lived in Crayford.
QUESTION 4: Who was Roald Dahl?
ANSWER Roald Dahl (1916 – 1990) lived at Ockwood, Hurst Road, Bexley from 1927 - 1937
QUESTION 5: Who is Quentin Blake?
ANSWER Quentin Blake (1932 – present) is an illustrator who was born in Sidcup and attended Chislehurst and Sidcup Grammar School
QUESTION 6: Who was William Morris?
ANSWER William Morris (1834 – 1896) was an artist and designer who lived at the Red House in Bexley
QUESTION 7: Who is Kate Bush?
ANSWER Kate Bush (1958 – present) is a singer/songwriter who was born in Bexleyheath and grew up on Wickham Lane in Welling
QUESTION 8: Who is Steve Backley?
ANSWER Steve Backley (1959 – present) is an Olympic javelin thrower who was born in Sidcup
QUESTION 9: Who is Lennox Lewis?
ANSWER Lennox Lewis (1965 – present) is a World Heavyweight champion boxer who lived in Crook Log as a child.
